Dates	Class Description
4/19/14	Class One – Handler Control This class covers the basic handling requirements for a successful visit with your dog and will also provide an over view of PAWS of CNY, Inc. programs and requirements. We will learn and practice loose leash walking and basic obedience as it applies to therapy dog programs. We will also discuss appropriate leashes and collar options, and help you to select what is best for your dog. This class will benefit beginner handlers who can learn these skills for the first time, as well as more experienced handlers who wish to practice and reinforce good behavior.
4/26/14	Class Two – Obedience with Distractions This class continues leash work and basic obedience skills required to pass our therapy dog evaluation with the addition of a variety of distractions. We will work on handler control, as well as getting and maintaining your dog's focus during active visits.
5/3/14	Class Three – Stress Management & Handling This class covers exposure to physical handling by strangers, including petting, hugging, managing in a crowd, and being examined. We will also practice having a person approach your dog in a way that simulates non-typical human behavior. You will learn handler skills to read your dog's body language and manage the situation appropriately. We will review typical signs of stress and other body language, which will be helpful not only during visits, but in all situations where your dog will need to communicate with you. Desensitizing and management techniques will be introduced.
5/10/14	Class Four – Medical Equipment This class covers exposure to medical equipment and handling your dog appropriately, including positioning the dog around the apparatus, asking your dog to climb into a chair for petting, and navigating successfully around items like a wheelchair, walker, or crutches. Different situations will be simulated for practice.
5/17/14	Class Five – Visit Simulation This class covers the cues your dog will need to know to be a successful therapy dog as well as helping you prepare to take the therapy dog evaluation. We will simulate a typical PAWS of CNY, Inc. nursing home visit from beginning to end, in the classroom.
